Kapalua Wine and Food Festival (Maui) — One of Hawai'i's most prestigious culinary festivals, the Kapalua Wine and Food Festival annually celebrates the delicious combination of fine food and wine with a four-day culinary extravaganza. The festival aims to explore some of the most exciting trends in the gastronomic world, bringing together world-renowned winemakers, top master sommeliers, celebrated chefs and industry insiders for themed tastings, seminars and evening gala culinary events. ♦ June 6-10, 2022

Hawaii Adaptive Surfing Championships (O'ahu) — Hawaii Adaptive Surfing Championships (HASC) brings together elite adaptive surfers from Hawai'i and around the world for competition at iconic Waikīkī surf break Queens. Hosted by AccesSurf Hawaii and Pacific Rim Sports, the event spotlights 90 surfers with disabilities from 16 nations competing in seven divisions with a mission of paving the path for the inclusion of surfing in the Paralympic Games. Competing surfers represent a high level of athleticism and dedication from around the world, joining to share their love of surfing with *aloha*. The competition includes a traditional Hawaiian blessing, a *lei* draping of Waikīkī's Duke Kahanamoku statue, hula performances and more. <u>AccesSurf.org</u>

• June 10-12, 2022

Hawai'i Kuauli Pacific and Asia Cultural Festival (island of Hawai'i) — This three-day celebration spotlights the island of Hawai'i and its significance as a cultural melting pot.

◆ June 10-12, 2022

Pan-Pacific Festival (O'ahu) — The Pan-Pacific Festival began in Hawai'i in 1980 as a cultural exchange between the state and Japan. Visiting participants from Japan were invited to enjoy the familiarity of Japanese music, crafts, traditions and foods, while Hawai'i residents and other visitors were offered opportunities to gain a deeper appreciation of Japanese sensibilities and cultural heritage. King Kamehameha Day Celebrations (island of Hawai'i) – Every June 11, gather on the island of Hawai'i to honor Kamehameha I, the chief who united the Hawaiian Islands in 1795. Festivities include a *lei* ceremony honoring the King Kamehameha statue, traditional Hawaiian dance, music, chant, practices, arts and crafts, *'ono* (delicious) food and more. King Kamehameha Celebration Floral Parade (O'ahu) — Celebrating its 150th anniversary, the colorful King Kamehameha Celebration Floral Parade honors the reign of the Kingdom of Hawai'i's first monarch, who united the Hawaiian Islands under his rule. The parade features brightly decorated floats, energetic marching bands and traditional $p\bar{a}'\bar{u}$ riders representing the Hawaiian royal court on horseback. • June 26, 2022

Kona Marathon and Family Fun Runs (island of Hawai'i) — In addition to a traditional marathon competition, the Kona Family Fun Runs offer half-marathon, 10K and 5K courses for runners of all ages and abilities. Don't miss the day-before-the-Kona Marathon Health and Fitness Fair, a family-friendly event featuring more than 45 vendor booths, entertainment, a speaker series and food. KonaMarathon.com
