JANUARY 2024

♦ January 4-7, 2024

The Sentry (Maui) — The Sentry — formerly The Sentry Tournament of Champions — opens the 2024 calendar year and the PGA Tour season on Maui's northwest coast at the Plantation Course at Kapalua. For the past 25 years, Maui has graciously hosted The Sentry, which aims to continue using its platform to ensure continued awareness, fundraising and support for the West Maui community. The Sentry features an accomplished field of pro golfers, including PGA Tour winners from the 2023 calendar year and the top 50 of final FedExCup standings. The Sentry annually attracts over 30 of the world's best golfers for tournament play. Sentry.com

Sony Open in Hawai'i (O'ahu) — Each January, the Sony Open in Hawai'i brings together 144 top golf professionals at O'ahu's Waialae Country Club. One of Hawai'i's largest charity golf events, the Sony Open in Hawai'i debuted in 1999, donating more than \$256,000 for 43 charities. Over the years, its fundraising and beneficiaries have grown significantly to an annual \$1.2 million for more than 100 local nonprofits. In total, the tournament has raised more \$23 million for 350-plus local organizations since its founding. ♦ March 3, 2024

Maui 5K (Maui) — Runners are invited to join the 13th annual Maui 5K, presented by the Maui Ocean Center, which includes opportunities to participate in the event's timed 5K race and an untimed 1-mile run or walk for *keiki* (children) and adults. In light of the 2023 Maui wildfires and their effect on the town of Lahaina's community and schools, race participants will have the option of designating their entry fees and/or donations to go to West Maui schools affected by the fires. APRIL 2024

♦ April 4-6, 2024

Kona Steel Guitar Festival (island of Hawaiʻi) — The second annual Kona Steel Guitar Festival will be held at the Outrigger Kona Resort and Spa in Keauhou. With entry free and open to the public, the concert event's highlights include a ho'olaule'a (celebration) featuring Hawaiian steel guitar masters; a Learn to Play workshop with hands-on steel guitar experience; open stage sessions featuring guest artists, performers and music groups from around the world and Hawaiʻi; kani ka pila jam sessions and a vintage steel guitar exhibit. Maui Marathon and Half Marathon (Maui) — The Maui Marathon is Hawai'i's longest consecutively-held running event and oldest marathon west of the Mississippi River. IRONMAN 70.3 Hawai'i Triathlon (island of Hawai'i) — A qualifying event for the October IRONMAN World Championship — also held on the island of Hawai'i — this Olympic-distance race is comprised of a 1.2-mile swim starting at beautiful Pauoa Bay, a 56-mile bike ride on the rolling hills and barren lava fields of the Kohala Coast, and a 13.1-mile run through the scenic grounds of Mauna Lani Golf Course. <u>Ironman.com</u>

3rd Annual King Kamehameha's Awesome Athletes Inclusive Canoe Race (island of Hawai'i) — This event brings together The Arc of Hilo, OSMD Hawai'i (Operation Sammy Muscular Dystrophy), and 'Ohana Wa'a Laulima in a joint effort to organize an inclusive paddling event held in Hilo Bay. The goal is to create a safe and welcoming environment where individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities can engage in a culturally significant sporting activity. Kapalua Wine and Food Festival (Maui) — One of Hawai'i's longest-running culinary festivals, the Kapalua Wine and Food Festival annually celebrates the delicious pairing of great food and great wine with a four-day culinary extravaganza. 13th Annual Festival of Pacific Arts & Culture (Oʻahu) — The Festival of Pacific Arts & Culture (FestPAC) is the world's largest celebration of indigenous Pacific Islanders. For the first time, the 13th annual celebration will convene in Hawaiʻi on the island of Oʻahu. More than 2,500 delegates including artists, cultural practitioners, scholars and officials from over 20 nations will gather on Oahu for 10-days of cultural exchange, appreciation and celebration at various venues across the island.
