### MĀLAMA HAWAI'I & CULTURE

Efforts relating to sustainability and caring for our people, place and culture.

**Bishop Museum (Oʻahu)** and the Hawaiian Council recently partnered to reimagine the museum's retail space as a hub for Hawaii-made products and cultural storytelling. The Hawaiian Council took over operations of the Bishop Museum's gift shop — formerly called Shop Pacifica — on July 1, introducing a refreshed space rooted in Native Hawaiian values and local creativity. The collaboration builds on the Hawaiian Council's retail projects The Mākeke and Nā Mea Hawaii, offering product showcases, creative workshops and community events reflecting the museum's role as a gathering place. <u>BishopMuseum.org</u>

In The Southern Sun is a new immersive art experience at the **Hyatt Regency Waikīkī Beach Resort and Spa (Oʻahu)**. Curated by POW! WOW! and Kamea Hadar, the exhibit traces the story of Waikīkī from dawn to dusk through murals, installations and interactive moments rooted in Native Hawaiian perspectives of place, seasonality and cultural memory. Featuring works by Hawaiʿi artists, the experience blends visual storytelling with *'ike kūpuna* (ancestral knowledge) to honor the land's past and present. InTheSouthernSun.com

In September, **Wahi Pana: Storied Places (O'ahu)** will unveil its third phase of island-wide public art installation openings at several culturally significant sites, including Kahe Point Beach Park, Ho'omaluhia Botanical Gardens, Hale'iwa Beach Park and Chinatown Gateway Plaza. The temporary art initiative, funded by the Bloomberg Philanthropies Public Art Challenge, brings together Native Hawaiian artists and storytellers to activate each location with site-specific sculptures, photography, poetry, *mele* (music) and immersive multimedia deepening connections to O'ahu's ancestral histories. Visitors can walk the area of each exhibit and reflect and engage with stories anchored in the 'āina (land). WahiPana.com

Wayfinder Waikiki (Oʻahu) recently launched two new sustainable guest experiences designed to deepen connections with Hawaiian culture and the 'aina (land). The hotel has partnered with The Genki Ala Wai Project for Genki-ball-making workshops, assembling the soil-and-microbial balls, which are then dropped in Waikīkī's Ala Wai Canal to help restore its ecosystem. In addition, monthly wa'a (canoe) restoration workshops, in collaboration with Friends of Hōkūle'a and Hawai'iloa, offer hands-on opportunities for guests to learn about traditional canoe building and help repair boat parts. #### NEW HOTEL DEVELOPMENTS
